We have been talking about the 12 most Famous Knights, as we have reached the end of our discussion with the 12th and final Knight of the most famous! The 12th Knight is Sir Henry Percy- 'Hot Spur' Sir Henry was born in 1364 in Northern England and was the Most famous member of the Percy family. Sir Henry was well thought of not only on the Battlefield but also in the Tournament arena! In 1377 at the tender age of 13 Henry was Knighted by King Edward III. Shortly after his Knighting he aided his father to recapture Berwick Castle from the Scots. In 1380 Henry Campaigned in Ireland and in 1383 he was on a crusade against the Lithuanians in Prussia. After 2-years he was patrolling the Scottish borders and was made Warden of the East March by Richard II. Sir Henry was captured at the battle of Otterburn in Scotland in 1388CE, Sir Henry was held for ransom and the money was raised by the King and Parliament. After which Henry turned against Henry IV and with his father helped the English King regain his throne, he recaptured Conway Castle from the Welsh in 1401CE and defeated the Scots at the Battle of Homildon Hill in 1402CE. The Percy family were not happy with Henry's lack of gratitude for having turned against Henry IV. Sir Henry Percy died at the battle of Shrewsbury while fighting the Kings forces, Henry was felled by a lucky arrow which hit him in the mouth when he opened his visor for a brief moment! Because of his disloyalty to the King, Henry's corpse was quartered and his head was put upon a spike at the gates of York. This served as a warning that even the Great Knights must always serve their Sovereign!
