I really want to begin with the Beatitudes, as referenced in Matthew, and pair them with the events of Holy week. Before I do that, I will regress to a bit of Biblical history. The Sermon on the Mount takes place relatively early in Jesus' ministry, after he has been baptized by John the Baptist, and after His fasting and meditation retreat in the desert, and begun to preach in Galilee. Now...the Beatitudes come from chapter 5 in the Book of Matthew. They are an important part of the Sermon on the Mount and serve to fulfill God's promise from Abraham by showing them the way to the kingdom of heaven. They respond to the desire for happiness that God has placed in our human hearts. (By the way, four of these blessings also appear in the Gospel of Luke, followed by four woes which mirror the blessings.)

And now, onto my article and pairings with some events of Holy week:

Passover dinner and Jesus' betrayal

"Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God" –Matthew 5:8 Jesus is arrested

"Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called the children of God" – Matthew 5:9

Jesus' crucifixion

"Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven" –Matthew 5:3

Jesus' death

"Blessed are those that mourn, for they will be comforted" –Matthew 5:4 Jesus' resurrection

"Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven" –Matthew 5:10

There are more Beatitudes than I have used here, yes, that's right, count them. Please read your Bible. You may make different choices, and that is OK as long as you give each one some thought.

As we reflect on Christ's journey let Him be the shining example for all of us to emulate. Take Him into your hearts. Share the joy of the resurrection! Christ has risen, ALLELUIA!
