## KNIGHTS TEMPLAR 53rd VOLUNTARY CAMPAIGN

Sir Knights;

The 52nd Voluntary Campaign for the Knights Templar Foundation ends on May 15, 2020 and the 53rd Voluntary Campaign begins. As it stands, at the time of this writing, the Sir Knights of Alabama have contributed \$10,680.00 to the 52nd campaign.

When the report of the 51st campaign was given at the Grand Commandery in February the contributions to the Eye Foundation were down \$3,747.87 less than the previous year and our Top Dollar Rank in contributions to the Eye Foundation was 31st, down from 23rd. Our Active Member Per Capita Average Rank was 38th, down from 25th and our Cumulative Total Dollar Rank was 32nd, down from 28th.

Sir Knights the realization that we are all constantly being asked to contribute to various charities is certainly something that we are aware of and there are very many worthy charities that are bidding for our contributions but as masons we should be putting our masonic charities first. Most all of the contributions made to our different philanthropies go to the charities, not to expenses of board members, expensive campaigns to solicit contributions, annual board meetings, etc. Much of the support of our philanthropies are fulfilled by faithful volunteers who receive nothing for their time.
