Along with attending the sun rise service current plans include a caravan from Michigan with a stop at the flight 93 National Memorial in Pennsylvania, An overnight stay in Breezewood PA, where we will put together special memorials for placement at Arlington. National Cemetery. Logistics have proven very cumbersome and the attendance nearly nil, over past trips so will not place a wreath at the "Tomb of the Unknown" *Instead*, we will place a special tribute arraignment at the intersection of sections 60 & 61, similar to what we did in 2014.
