Now, back to our two major holidays. President Washington made the first National Proclamation of a Day of Prayer and Thanksgiving on November 26, 1789. Prayers of gratitude were to be directed to Divine Providence in creating the United States and the new Federal Constitution. The annual celebration of Thanksgiving, however, did not come about until President Abraham Lincoln and Congress declared on October 3, 1863, that a Day of Thanksgiving would be on the fourth Thursday of November of every year as a testimonial to the union victory at Gettysburg which changed the course of the war and preserved the Union.

Armistice Day, now referred to as Veterans Day, came about in gratitude for the end of World War I and was celebrated on the 11th Day of the month. The armistice was signed and became effective on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918.

Two very special days of prayer and thanksgiving. As the days shorten and the dark hours of a Covid- 19 winter lengthen, there still is a very great deal to be thankful for: family, friends, a peaceful land to live in – and Life, itself.
