Greetings Sir Knights:

If you have been attentive this Templar year, you are aware that St. Paul and his teachings are a focus for my year as Grand Commander. In getting through this pandemic I wanted to share a popular writing of his and explore its' message:

For we walk by faith, not by sight, 2 Corinthians 5:7; KJV

What does this verse mean or imply? First - in some versions of the bible, walk is replaced by *live*. This has generally been held as acceptable – but in doing so, has led to a different interpretation of the verse.

When *live* is used in the verse, it generally implies that the Corinthians must/should live a life of *faith*. That verb tense implies seeking. When reading the rest of Chapter 5 and considering the other verses along with verse 7, it is interpreted that St Paul is simply stating a fact. The Corinthians already *walk* (have faith). Thus, we already have *faith*.

The reference to *sight* is described as physical sight and implied that now we cannot see the Lord.

So, what does all this mean? Faith and Trust

We walk and thus live in the faith of our Lord in the unseen.

We take our next steps in *trust* and take it blindly for we have *faith* – that will guide us.

I simply put forward this verse to bring an analogy between St. Paul's writing and our current situation. Yes, the verse is set between our

lives on earth and our future eternal life with the Lord in heaven.

However, in our current time, if we keep our *faith* and beliefs in the Lord, we will get through this pandemic together. God is leading us.

Keep the *faith* my Fraters!

I continue with prayers for you, your families and loved ones to be safe and happy not only during these times, but for all times.
