Fodrea elected Grand Commander, finally, and in unique manner

Sir Knight Ed Fodrea, Fort Wayne, was elected and installed on Aug. 8 as Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery, Knights Templar, of the state of Indiana.

The headline says "finally," because it took place more than three months late. Grand Commandery rules state the Grand Conclave should be held in late April. However, because of the hazard to attending Sir Knights and their families caused by the novel Corona Virus, the date kept being pushed back and pushed back.

Finally, the Grand Master of the Grand Encampment Knights Templar of the United States of America issued General Order 12, generally forbidding many face-to-face events, so plans for a face-to-face conclave were thrown out and an unprecedented electronic conclave happened in its place. Unprecedented it may have

been, but as many of the standard rules applied as possible: each subordinate Commandery had to have its Eminent Commander, Generalissimo, and Captain General or their proxies present, and everyone attending electronically had to be in uniform, minus chapeau and sword, or an acceptable equivalent.

"It's a bittersweet thing," SK Fodrea said of the delayed election and installation. "We hate it that Covid 19 has put a damper on many of our plans, but the health and safety of our Sir Knights is our first priority."
