Greetings Sir Knights:

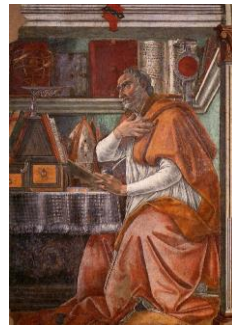
Welcome to 2021! It is customary at the beginning of a new year to make resolutions and/or recommit oneself.
