Jacques de Molay was born between 1240 and 1250. He died being burned on a scaffold on an Island in the River Seine, this month March 11 or 18, 1314, 707 years ago, along with his three preceptors. The Templars were convicted of Heresy by King Philip IV of France in order to claim the wealth of the Templars to pay his debts. Jacques de Molay served as Grand Master from 1292 to 1314.

"The Order of DeMolay" now DeMolay International was founded in March 24, 1919 by Brother Frank S. Land in Kansas City, Missouri.
