We are in the final preparation for our Grand Conclave, to be held June 3-5 in Des Moines. We will be holding the session at the Scottish Rite Consistory and the headquarters hotel will be the Hilton Downtown Des Moines. A group rate for this even has been secured, and I'm looking forward to a nice turnout. We will be holding the Ritual Competition in the 10-Man Opening from 2-4 on Thursday, June 3. I know of a few Commanderies participating, but I would like to see a few more. The informal opening will be the Vesper Service, where we will welcome Pastor Paul Smith to give a presentation on his Holy Land Pilgrimage, which was accomplished shortly before COVID hit in 2020. I am sure he will have an engaging talk and I look forward to hearing about his experience.

We will have significant business to accomplish at our Conclave on Friday and Saturday. Most of the proposed legislation will involve the forming of a non-profit corporation to execute the duties of Grand Recorder and Grand Treasurer, in addition to discussions around Life Sponsors for the Eye Foundation. These are important discussions that will impact the future direction of your Grand Commandery, so I encourage all to come and make your voice heard.

What can we do to light a fire with that spark? I urged you back in the summer to think

Now that we have had the restrictions lifted, there is no reason to not be meeting, conferring our Orders and becoming the light in our communities that we should be. I would like to encourage this conversation at our Grand Conclave. I realize there are a variety of difficulties to overcome family and work obligations to get in the way, compete for our time etc. But I think you joined this Order for a reason, and I am asking you to reflect on this and be honest with yourself about its meaning in your life. If this is no more than a social club to you and you like it that way, that's fine, too.
