## Grand Prelate's Corner

This month I want us to center for a moment on another important aspect of the Christian faith that occurs forty days after the resurrection. This year it will be celebrated on Thursday, May 13. 2021. Have you guessed what that celebration is? It is Ascension Day.

For 40 days after his resurrection, the Bible says that Jesus travelled and preached with his apostles, preparing them for his departure from Earth. Ascension Day marks the moment Jesus literally ascended into heaven before his disciples, at the village of Bethany, near Jerusalem. The Ascension marks the conclusion of Jesus' post-resurrection appearances. It is the final elevation of his human nature to divine glory and the near presence of God.

The Ascension is affirmed by the Nicene and Apostles' Creeds. Ascension is important for us as Christians because it assures us that Jesus Christ reigns with the Father in heaven and is there to intercede for us and by our faith in him we will be granted a place in paradise. Ascension Day's meaning provides a sense of hope that the glorious and triumphant return of Christ is near. It is a reminder of the Kingdom of God within the Templar's heart, and of the ever-present Spirit of God, watching over and protecting us as we spread the light of Jesus' truth throughout the world.

The Ascension of Christ points to the kingship of Christ, and the theological implication is that the Ascension was the final redemptive act conferring participation in the divine life on all who are members of Christ. In other words, Christ "was lifted up into heaven so that he might make us partakers of his Godhead." That's why Templars observe this event for it adds another piece of the puzzle of gospel story concluding with the Day of Pentecost when the Holy Spirit will come and lite upon us all.

So we see and experience the gospel story as birth, life, death, resurrection and ascension. It with be finally wrapped with the gift of the Holy Spirit to empower us for service until Christ's return.
