Your call may be the only one they've had in quite a while. Let them know that they are not forgotten and that we are here for them. Ask them if there is anything they may need. If they are in need, assist if possible or find someone who may be able. If no help is needed, that's okay. Maybe you fulfilled their need just by calling and speaking with them and letting them know that you care for their well being and that they are your Brothers through thick and thin.

Another thing I like to do while on these small reflection journeys, is education. You can never have too much education. There is always something to learn. Speaking from a purely Masonic sense, there are countless books, essays, papers, and articles out there to gain knowledge and understanding. I try to get as much time as I can to continue that education. The range of topics can move from a purely historical outlook like the founding of Masonry in general or Florida Masonry for a more localized history, or even our own Lodge or York Rite Bodies. Maybe we are more interested in Ritual and learning a new part for a Degree or Order. Philosophy more your taste? Multiple volumes have been written for further light. There are many paths to be taken through our journey in Masonry. Sometimes the best knowledge or understanding of learned knowledge comes from those that have come before. Our own membership can be a vast resource. Whatever yours may be, try to find a moment to advance your knowledge and reflect on what you learn. Set your own pace and get as much as you can from the resources you have. Never stop learning and growing.

Our journey through life is hardly ever a straight line, and almost never an easy one. Education, communication, and inward reflection are all great tools in making it more enjoyable. I hope, in reading this, that I have been able to possibly give someone some thoughts to ponder.
