The Grand Commandery of Minnesota met in Grand Conclave on Saturday, June 26, 2021. The Sir Knights of Minnesota were represented well. SK Sean Gardiner, Right Eminent Grand Commander, called the Grand Commandery from refreshment to Labor at 09:00 in Alexandria, MN. The weather was beautiful as we started out our business. This year, we were joined by the Most Eminent Grandmaster of Knights Templar of the United States of America, SK Jeffrey Nelson, as well as our Most Worshipful Grand Master of Masons in Minnesota, Most Worshipful Brother Rolf Widstrand (who happens to be a great Sir Knight as well).

The Grand Conclave was attended by approximately 100 Sir Knights, with a total of 52 voting delegates. These delegates represented 12 of the 14 active Commanderies in the state. Our normal business was undertaken, including the budgeting for our next Templar year, followed by the business at hand. There were a total of eight resolutions that were in form and received a lively debate. All but two of the resolutions were passed with the majority necessary to become part of our Constitution. The two resolutions which were tabled were the Uniform Resolution and the resolution that would remove the requirement of be a Companion in Cryptic Council as a requirement for the Orders of Knighthood.

Elections were accomplished as expected, with SK Joseph J Anderson being elected to the office of Grand Commander, SK David Dumonceaux as Deputy Grand Commander, SK Alan Mackenzie as Grand Generalissimo, SK Jerry Zierdt as Grand Captain General, SK David Seitz as Grand Treasurer and Brian Dimatteo, PGC, as Grand Recorder. Installation took place immediately following the Grand Conclave with our Most Eminent Grandmaster presiding as Installing Officer.

While there were a few issues during the weekend, it was great to see our Sir Knights and your officers in person again. There were countless hours spent getting to know each other again, and the events provided a time for everyone to enjoy themselves. Remember, the Grand Conclave is your Conclave, the events are for you as well.
