THON is a student-run philanthropy committed to enhancing the lives of children and families impacted by childhood cancer. Every school day, 43 children are diagnosed with cancer, but 16,500 student volunteers are working to change that. Their mission is to provide emotional and financial support, spread awareness, and ensure funding for critical research—all in pursuit of a cure. This year long effort by the students culminates in February with a 46-hour dance marathon. \$190+ million raised. This money stays here in PA supporting the Four Diamonds Fund at Penn State Hershey Medical Center. Four Diamonds was established by Charles and Irma Millard after their son, Christopher, passed away after battling cancer for three years at the age of 14. Shortly before he lost his battle with cancer, he wrote a story about a great knight who sought out the four diamonds of courage, wisdom, honesty and strength,

in order to be released from the grips of an evil sorceress, which was the inspiration for the name Four Diamonds. Through Four Diamonds, Chris Millard and his legendary story of Sir Millard live on, and serve as a beacon of hope for children and their families fighting cancer.
