Commanderies who wish to compete for the Sid Dorris Award and who meet the criteria are encouraged to do so. These Commanderies will be graded in a full inspection making use of the Recorder's records dating from October 1, 2021, as described in General Order #5 issued September 30, 2021.

I eagerly look forward to visiting our Commanderies across the state again. I would have never imagined that I would miss hearing the Order conferred 20+ times each summer, but I do. In fact, very little compares to the good will perpetuated among the Sir Knights each time I witness it.

Finally, Sir Knights if I could only make one request of you this year, it would be something that I hope you agree would be the most beneficial to your Commandery and to Templary as a whole.
