From the Editor

We are fast approaching that time of the year when our Spring York Rite Festivals will be put on for our candidates. No doubt many candidates have eagerly awaited the time when we open back up and resume normal activities. They are ready. Are you?

Check your answers with this checklist:

- ☑ Do you have degree captains/coordinators in place to ensure all degree roles are filled and everyone is prepared?
- ☑ Have you met with your degree team to practice roles including floor work?
- ☑ Have you communicated the schedule to all candidates including setting expectations for dress code, meals, start and end times?☐ Have you reserved the appropriate rooms, confirmed all costumes and props are ready, and meals planned?
- ☑ Have you informed the Grand Commander that you will be conferring the Order of the Temple including where/when it will be conferred?
- ☑ Do you have a plan for the Festival days including official start time for each day and estimate starts and finishes for each degree?
- ☑ Who has the key to the front door and when does he arrive? (You'd be surprised how often that gets overlooked!)

In my chosen profession, project management, we have a saying, "failure to plan is planning to fail." I remind my students in class that "plan" is not a dirty 4-letter word, and planning is not such an arduous task as long as you keep things simple and spread the work around. If you're the point-man for your local bodies' Spring Festival, don't feel like you must go it alone. Ask for help, delegate tasks to those willing and able to execute them. Communicate openly and often, and be sure to listen to feedback. Plan ahead, and when you have a solid plan, WRITE IT DOWN so you don't have to rediscover it next time.

After your festival is concluded, what next? Here are some suggestions:

Have the three presiding officers of your local bodies sign and present a personalized welcome letter to each new member. Include a calendar of

events for the year including regular meeting times/dates, fundraisers, and other gatherings.

- ⚠ Invite each new member to participate in the degrees, take on parts, deliver educational presentations, and attend meetings.
- ➡ Host a post-festival review with your degree teams to identify what went well and what can be improved and WRITE IT DOWN.
- Host discussions with new members to discuss the symbolism and deeper meanings of each degree and how it is relevant to them. Don't lecture at them, let them speak to what the degrees mean to each of them.
- ➤ Start planning for the Fall Festival. It will be here before you know it!

Above all, never forget that the most important person at any degree conferral is always, always, always the CANDIDATE. Do your best to provide the best experience for the candidates; it's usually their first impression of you as an organization and will certainly be the most enduring one after the day is done. Make them feel welcome and at ease. Answer their questions. Make sure they understand what is going on and what to do. Welcome them to the York Rite and invite them to come back and take on a part!

I wish you all the best and may your Festivals run smoothly, and the candidates all enjoy your hard work and planning!
