The previous day, our Right Eminent Grand Commander was installed as Eminent Prior of New Hampshire Priory No. 58, Knights of the York Cross of Honor, succeeding Sir Knight Paul C. Smith, Right Eminent Past Grand Commander. The Deputy Prior is **Sir Knight Patrick J. O'Sullivan**, Right Eminent Past Grand Commander. For those who may be unaware, Convent General of the Knights of the York Cross of Honor, through its Medical Foundation, has for many years supported groundbreaking research in the prevention and treatment of cancer at the Norris Cotton Cancer Center at the Geisel School of Medicine of Dartmouth College. It has produced very promising results in the field of immunotherapy for certain types of cancer.

Speaking of medical research, the Knights Templar Eye Foundation published the results of the 54th Annual Voluntary Campaign. Our New Hampshire Sir Knights contributed \$11,538.00 this year, ranking

37th among the Grand Commanderies. Our *per capita* contribution was \$37.83, 10th among the Grand Commanderies, a result of which we can be justly proud. Hopefully, we will do even better in the coming year. Each of our Commanderies should strive to achieve 100% Life Sponsorship for its Sir Knights. A Life Sponsorship is only \$30.00 and relieves the Commandery of the annual Eye Foundation assessment for each Life Sponsor. Our Grand Commandery achieved this goal in 1994, but not all who have been Knighted since have become Life Sponsors. My Commandery used to purchase a Life Sponsorship for each new Sir Knight, but the practice seems to have lapsed in the recent past. We have some catching up to do. I encourage each Commandery to adopt the practice.
