Sir Knights,

In a few days we will observe the Feast of Pentecost, fifty days after **our Savior's passion**, when His mission was finally fulfilled and the age of the Kingdom of God, present in the church, began. Fifty represents eternal and heavenly fulfillment: seven times seven plus one.

A few short weeks ago, we convened for the 172nd Annual Grand Conclave in Concord where our new Right Eminent Grand Commander, Sir Knight Earl W. Cole, Jr., and his officers assumed the leadership of the Grand Commandery for the coming Chivalric year.

Sir Knight Earl William Cole, Jr. was born December 18, 1946, in Uniontown, Pennsylvania. He graduated from Fisher Junior College with an Associate Degree in Business Management. He enjoyed fifty-two years of marriage to his beloved Lady Alice (née Berutis) who passed in February. He resides in Rindge, New Hampshire, where he enjoys riding his horses and bicycling.

He was employed some thirty-eight years in the Personal Trust Division of State Street Bank and Trust Company, retiring as Vice President of the Systems Support Unit. He also served his country in the United States Air Force and the United States Air Force Reserve, retiring with the rank of Senior Master Sergeant.

Sir Knight Cole was initiated, passed, and raised in King Cyrus Lodge, Reading, Massachusetts, in 1996, serving as Worshipful Master from 1999 through 2001. He served the Grand Lodge of Massachusetts, as District Deputy Grand Master, in 2001 through 2003, and the Grand Lodge of New Hampshire, as District Deputy Grand Lecturer, in 2010 and 2011, and, as District Deputy Grand Master, from 2011 through 2013. He is Secretary of Charity Lodge No. 18, in East Jaffrey, and Grand Representative of the Grand Lodge of Texas near the Grand Lodge of New Hampshire. He was awarded the Jeremy Ladd Cross Medal, in 2013, and the Major General John Sullivan Medal, in 2018. He was exalted to the degree of Royal Arch Mason January 14, 2012. A Past High Priest of Trinity Chapter No. 2, in Concord, he is currently Eminent Principal Sojourner of the Grand Royal Arch Chapter of New Hampshire and Grand Representative of Texas near the Grand Chapter of New Hampshire. He received the Distinguished Service Medal in 2017. He was greeted as a Select Master May 30, 2012. A Past Thrice Illustrious Master of Horace Chase Council No. 4, in Concord, he is currently Illustrious Conductor of the Council of the Grand Council of New Hampshire.

Sir Knight Cole was Knighted June 22, 2012. He is a Past Eminent Commander of Mt Horeb Commandery No. 3, in Concord. He was installed as Right Eminent Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of New Hampshire, during the 172nd Annual Grand Conclave May 14, last, in Concord. He holds the Knight Templar Cross of Honor and, in 2021, was created a Knight Commander of the Temple. He is Grand Representative of Texas near the Grand Commandery of New Hampshire.

His other Masonic activities include the following: John Harris Council No. 458, Allied Masonic Degrees; Palestine Tabernacle XLI, Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests; Scenic Council No. 37, Knight Masons; Profile York Rite College No. 100; New Hampshire Priory No. 58, Knights of the York Cross of Honor; The

Royal Order of Scotland; and Granite State Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine. In 1997, he became a 32-degree Scotlish Rite Mason in the Valley of Boston and a Noble of Aleppo Shrine in Massachusetts.
