To the Officers and Knights of the Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Tennessee, and to the Officers and Knights of the Constituent Commanderies thereof:

Sir Knights,

The month of November includes two days of tremendous importance to our nation and in particular to us as Christian Knights – Veterans’ Day and Thanksgiving. Veterans’ Day began as a remembrance of the Armistice that ended the fighting during World War 1, and to honor those who fought in that conflict; it was later expanded to include veterans of all wars, and is a day we appropriately thank those who serve in our Nation’s Armed Forces.

Thanksgiving Day has a long history, beginning with the legendary first Thanksgiving celebrated by those who came here in search of religious freedom. President George Washington issued the first official proclamation for Thanksgiving, to give thanks for the ending of the Revolutionary War and the establishment of our new Constitution; President Lincoln established in 1863, as a day to “heal the wounds of the nation.” On Thanksgiving, then, it is appropriate not only to give thanks for those material blessings we have received from our Father, but also to give thanks for the shared heritage of freedom that we enjoy as Americans.
