Many other jurisdictions have done so to save money and free up an extra weekend. So, the heads of the Iowa York Rite bodies have worked together, as well as many of the officers to make this happen. If these combined Grand Sessions go well, this will continue. If there are too many problems, the sessions can be separated. As to the state of the Iowa Grand Commandery: We continue to lose more members than we gain mostly through attrition and deaths. We are getting a trickle of new quality members. We need more new quality members. We offer outstanding quality ritual and ceremony work. The high standards in our work and members must be maintained. This can be achieved with rigorous inspections and schools of instruction followed up with practice and rehearsal in the local Commandery.

We have two weak commanderies in Iowa, both in large metropolitan areas. They each need an infusion of "New Blood". This can happen with the support of strong commanderies in the area and strong leadership, infused or from the local ranks. Here at the Iowa Grand Conclave, I am granting a UD, Under Dispensation Charter to Adrian. They will meet at Acanthus Lodge in Des Moines. This Under Dispensation is good for one year. At that time, it can be relinquished, not renewed, extended or a regular charter granted. They currently have Ascalon Chapter #139 and Arcturus Council #63 but no Commandery. This will give them the full complement of the base York Rite bodies. Their application for UD is complete and well ordered.

Again, I express my utmost and deepest heartfelt thanks to all the Sir Knights of Iowa as well as the Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Iowa. It has been my pleasure to serve.
