Grand Commander's Traveling Sword

In an effort to encourage and promote

inter-Commandery communication, cooperation, and fellowship, the Knights Templar Association of Colorado is a proud sponsor of the Grand Commander's *Traveling Sword Program*. The Sword is held by a Commandery, until another Commandery visits, and captures, the Traveling Sword. They hold it until it is captured, in turn, from them and taken to the new Commandery.

The Traveling Sword is an exact reproduction of the swords carried by the Knights Templar in the 12th Century made in Toledo Spain. Its blade is of tempered steel embossed with 24-karat gold. The medallions inset and topped with a Templar's Cross.
