What a great turnout. Pretty nice weather for February allowed for plenty of masons to show up and March in the parade and witness the Cornerstone re-enactment first hand. Thousands showed up. Estimates range from 3500-4000 Masons from around the world were on hand to take part.

Your Maryland Grand Commandery was well represented with members from several Commanderies across the State. Maryland Commandery #1 and Monumental Crusade Commandery #3 brought out their Beauceants to lead the array of Knights Templar, followed by the Grand Lodge of Maryland with Grand Master Fred Spicer and Deputy Grand Master Randall Watson leading the way. Following them were Knights Templars from Virginia and Washington DC. What a great day for masonry with several large contingents from as far as Texas and California among others.

The Grand Encampment was represented by the Most Eminent Grand Master of the Grand Encampment David Kussman. Department Commander James Steele also joined us from North Carolina and a group of Templars from that State were also present. The event was live streamed to members of the craft by Masons from the Scottish Rite on their YouTube channel.
