Arlington National Cemetery, Arlington, VA – For years now the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of North Carolina has been placing a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier in Arlington National Cemetery, Arlington VA. The past couple of years has seen an increased friendship between the Tomb Sentinels and the Knights Templar of North Carolina. The Tomb Sentinels have always been very courteous and helpful to attending Sir Knights and

have always given a tour of their barracks at the Tomb.

On October 8, 2022, Sir **Knights** representing the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of North Carolina went to the Tomb and made a presentation of a crusader sword, plaque, and care package, to show our appreciation for all Tomb Sentinels the have done over the years and how much we support their efforts.

This Easter weekend, Saturday April 8, 2023, a contingent of NC Knights Templar, led by Right Eminent Grand Commander Brandon Penley, Eminent Grand Jr. Warden Mark Alexander, Eminent Standard Bearer Sam Henline, and Sir Knight Matthew Holland went to the Tomb of the Unknowns to place a wreath, and although we arrived late the Sentinels still allowed us to conduct the ceremony.

As our wreath ceremony was the last of the day, it was our honor to learn that our wreath would be left at the Tomb until after sundown before removal.

Afterward the Tomb Sentinels took the assembled Sir Knights, and guest, on a tour inside the underground barracks area, and showed everyone the Crusader Sword and plaque mounted to the wall outside the sleeping quarters.

A Tomb Sentinel told me that spot was chosen because ALL the Sentinels have to pass by it on their way to duty, and it has been an inspiration, and encouragement to each of them, a Warrior Spirit. I was somewhat amazed that we had had that effect, and I must admit that I was proud that NC Templary was having a positive effect on these young men's lives. I also let them know that another care package had been delivered to the Sgt. of the Guard for distribution on Easter morning.

But an Easter miracle was yet to happen, the Tomb Sentinels had a special gift for us, especially involving my family. Major Ian Campbell Brinkley is the son of one of my Lady Beth's cousins, and Ian passed away at the age of 42, from an illness he contracted during the Gulf War where he was a combat pilot for the USMC. I knew Ian's mother and father could not make it to Ian's grave this Easter, so I asked one of the Tomb Sentinels what they did with the wreaths after removing them from the Tomb. He told me

groundskeepers took care of removing them. I asked if he could possibly do me a favor and place our wreath on Ian's grave, and send me a photo, so I could let Ian's parents know he had not been forgotten for Easter. The young Sentinel told me he would take care of it.

Now here's the miracle: the Sentinel relief Unit arrived early Sunday morning April 9, 2023, and around 4:00am these twelve men went to the Tomb of the Unknowns, took the wreath we placed there, and conducted a private wreath ceremony at Major Ian C. Brinkley's grave, and yes, they sent a picture. What better example of friendship and brotherly love can you find?

Needless to say, Major Brinkley's parents were overwhelmed with joy, thanking the Templars and the Tomb Sentinels.

I still get misty eyed just thinking about these twelve young men, taking time out of one of their busiest days, to render this service. They didn't have to do this favor; I think they did it because they knew the meaning behind Templary. I know they certainly perk up when they hear the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of North Carolina is on the premises.

On the back of the Tomb Sentinel challenge coin is the phrase, "Silence and Respect", I think they should also include Honor.
