GRAND COMMANDERS MESSAGE

As I am sitting here, I am thinking of the year ahead. We came out of Covid last year finding a huge drop in Commanderies being ready to stand inspection in Opening, Receiving and Closing. The Order of the Temple was out of the Question. Opening and Closing are the life blood of Masonry and needs to be done properly at all meetings. The Order of the Temple is the only order required to stand inspection. The Commander cannot receive the Past Commanders Ceremony without doing it. The Order of the Red Cross and the Order of Malta should be worked also.

Last year the Grand Commander authorized Schools to bring the knowledge of Opening, Receiving and Closing back to the Sir Knights in the Commanderies. The Inspectors came to the Commanderies and taught the work. The OICs were also sent to help their assigned Commanderies practice and help with the Order of the Temple.

This year there will be no Schools. The OICs will visit the Commanderies in the quest to do the Openings, Reception and Closing and The Order of the Temple. We cannot grow if we do not have the ability to do the required work. Masonic Lodges that cannot do the work cannot survive. I am not chastising the Commanderies or Sir Knights for I have seen the difficulties involved in getting Sir Knights to attend, participate or take positions in the line. This is where the work begins. We have to find ways to make our meetings interesting and Sir Knights desire to be present and learn how to take responsibility for a part or office. We need to find those Christian Masons and explain the distinguishing attributes of the Knights Templar. Don't forget the Chapter and Council degrees, especially the Royal Arch. The Knights have to be there first.

The problems do not stop there. The foundation of our Order is Blue Lodge Master Masons. The number of Masons in Oklahoma is in decline. Suspensions and death are the exceeding the making of new Master Masons and the foundations of the Dependent Bodies are crumbling. Churches and Civic Groups are also suffering. Along with convincing Brother Masons of the Christian values of the Order and taking the Christ Jesus into our Masonic Lives we need to work at the Blue Lodge level to find the young men who will carry on the values of Masonry

well into the future. We also need to contact the suspensions and find their reasons for doing so. Tell them we value them and their input, want them back and will work to address problems that sent them on their way.

If each of us would bring in one new member we could double our membership and if they bring in one triple etc. etc. YOU have set yourself on the course of Knowledge and self improvement by furthering yourself in the Orders. I laud your spirit and drive and I pray that we will be able to keep Masonry and therefore Knighthood with the Christ Jesus for those who follow. I am open to all ideas, please observe and find ideas that may help us in our quest and pass them on.
