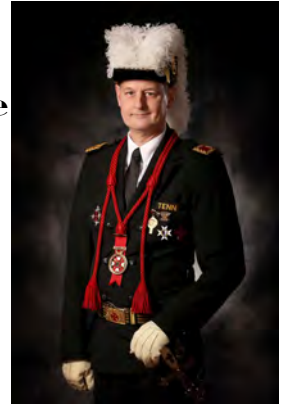

Christian Chivalric Values Part 6

Last year, we began a series of articles on the "Christian Chivalric Values" as set forth by Sir Knight Richard Van Dorn, the first of which is, "*A firm belief in the Lord Jesus Christ and his church.*" The sixth value is "*An impetus to come to the rescue of others, no matter their circumstances.*"

This value has always been my strength or my downfall, depending on how you look at it, especially when it comes to someone treating someone else badly when they do not deserve it. I grew up under the influence of Roy Rogers, The Lone Ranger, Matt Dillon, and John Wayne. These guys were constantly coming to the rescue of someone in distress, usually someone who was being taken advantage of. I guess, because of this, I have the urge to get involved when someone is being mistreated.

On the other hand, my dad gave me some really good advice many years ago. He said, "Son, there are a lot of things going on in the world, and most of them are none of your business, so you had best stay out of them."

So, how do you decide when to get involved in other people's struggles? Well, I think Davy Crockett had the right idea when he said, "Make sure you are right, and then go ahead." First, I would say that unless you really understand what is going on, be careful; you might just make things worse. Second, make sure you are willing to pay the price without grumbling if you have to sacrifice to help. Trust me on this; I have obtained a number of stitches and lost substantial amounts of money when coming to the aid of an underdog. If you are going to complain about your losses and injuries, you probably should not have gotten involved in the first place.

I would also suggest that you limit your involvement to situations that really matter. Trivial disagreements and minor offenses just are not worth butting in. Ultimately though, what is the point of being a Knight if you cannot rescue someone from time to time? The world is full of injustice and evil. Most of the time we, as individuals, cannot do anything about it. When we can, however, we need to seize the opportunity to right a wrong and come to the aid of the victim. That is called chivalry, and that is what sets us apart as Knights.

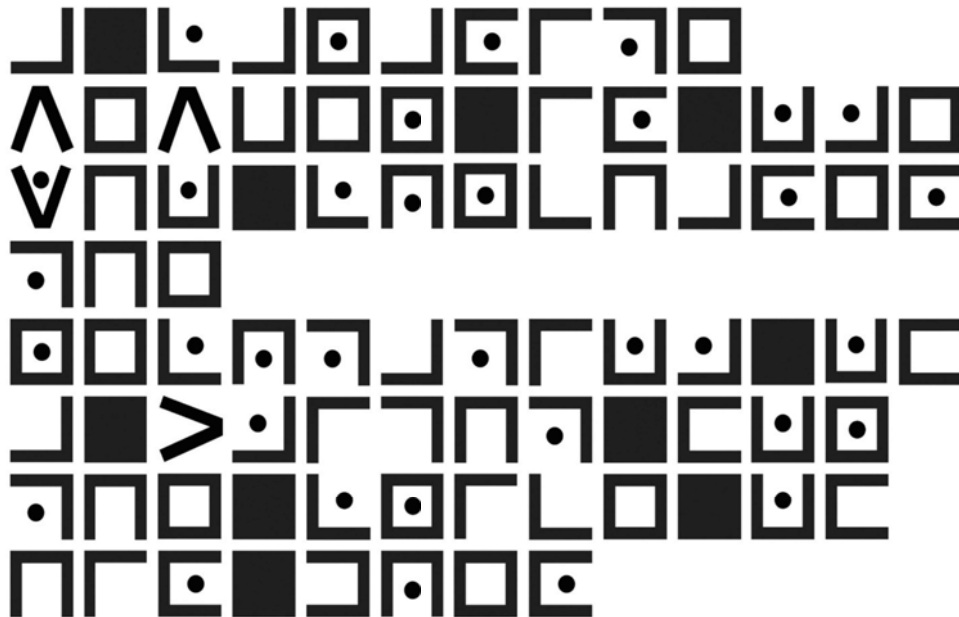

Any previous credit will be applied to your total. If credit is still available, you will be informed as to how much you have left. If there is a deficit, you will be invoiced for the difference. If paying by credit card, the appropriate fee will be added.

NOTES

- 1) If you order meal (s), with the intent to pay at registration/pick up, then do not show, you are still responsible for the costs/payment of those meals you ordered. **An invoice will be sent to you for the cost of the meals you purchased.**
- 2) If you order meals and send in the payment, then do not attend, after the meal order has been placed with caterer, we cannot return your funds.
- 3) **If you order meals and paid by previous credit, then do not attend, after the meal order has been placed with caterer, your credit will be used to pay for the meals you ordered.**

Companions and Sir Knights:

We are looking forward to seeing you at the Southeastern York Rite Conference to be held at the Knoxville Airport Hilton on June 14 and 15, 2024. One of the quirks of the Knoxville Airport is that it is not in Knoxville or even in Knox County Tennessee but is in fact in beautiful Alcoa Tennessee. The Hilton Hotel is on the airport property, so it is convenient for those who are traveling by air to the Conference. For those who have not visited the Great Smokey Mountains National Park, Alcoa is just a 30-minute drive to the Townsend Entrance to the Park. In addition, for the Shop-a-holics out there, Pigeon Forge and Gatlinburg are only an hour away from the Hotel. The Hilton Hotel will extend the Room Rate beyond the Conference Schedule for those who wish to extend their stay in East Tennessee.

The Hilton is located at 2001 Alcoa Highway, Alcoa Tennessee, 37701. You can make reservations by calling the Hilton at 865 970 4300 and request the Grand York Rite Rate which is \$145.00 per night excluding tax. Parking is free in the Hilton Parking lot. The deadline for making reservations is May 14, 2024.

Attached is a Registration and meal order form. Everyone who attends the conference or attends a Leadership meeting will need to register. Meals are not a part of the Registration Fee. Tickets will be distributed to those who purchase meals, and the tickets will be collected at the door to the Ballroom. There will be a Tennessee River Cruise with Lunch for the Ladies on Friday. Tickets can be purchased with the Registration Package. The deadline for meal orders is May 31, 2024.

A reminder to all Southeastern Grand Commanderies: all Grand Commanders, Deputy Grand Commanders, Grand Generalissimos, Grand Captain Generals and Grand Recorders are required by the Grand Encampment Constitution to attend a Department Conference each year. If you have a scheduling issue you have two choices, one you can attend another Department Conference or two you can in the case of an emergency request an excused absence from the Grand Master of the Grand Encampment.

The Conference is intended to be focused on York Rite Masonry, but everyone who attends a Leadership Course will benefit from the class. In the past, DeMolay, Rainbow, Eastern Star and Blue Lodge Masons who are not York Rite Masons have attended the meeting and have all voiced their great admiration for the Knowledge that was imparted to them during the session.
