## Grand Commander's Message

Greetings Sir Knights,

It's hard to believe it is already May! With the coming of May, we as Christians will be celebrating Ascension Day, which commemorates our belief of the bodily Ascension of Jesus into heaven, where he is seated on the right hand of Our Father. Following the account of Acts 1:3 that the risen Jesus appeared for 40 days prior to his Ascension, Ascension Day is traditionally celebrated on a Thursday, the fortieth day of Easter, although some Christian denominations have moved the observance to the following Sunday, sometimes called Ascension Sunday.

Whether you will celebrate Ascension Day on May 9 or May 12, please take time for prayer and reflection on this Holy day. Easter weekend saw me in our Nation's Capital for the Grand Encampment's Easter Observance. Saturday night, Lady Jody and I attended the Banquet honoring the Grand Commanders in attendance and hosted by SK David J. Kussman, our Most Eminent Grand Master. **Knights Templar at the Monroe Christmas Parade: A Memoir by SK Galard Moore**

**Monroe** – At our meeting of November 2023, the Senior Warden, Douglas Moore of Truth Lodge #749 asked the lodge to consider participating in the Monroe Christmas Parade. After much discussion, we agreed to participate and they would ask Terry Pritt, Master of Monroe Lodge #244, to assist them and invite the entire 29<sup>th</sup> Masonic District to assist us. The members met to plan what we would do in helping with the parade.

We obtained a 1929 Buick vehicle belonging to WB Jerry C. Page to be driven in the parade. WB Bruce Reynolds, Past Master of Monroe Lodge furnished a beautiful red tractor and a 40-foot-long trailer. The flat-bed trailer was decorated by members of our Masonic Lodges, along with members of the DeMolay, Union

County Shrine Club, Charlotte Scottish Rite, Monroe York Rite, and Rainbow Girls local bodies and assemblies. Bales of straw were placed down the middle of the trailer with a tarp placed on top for people to sit on. We had more than 43 members on the trailer.

The parade route was approximately 2 miles long and we had people standing four deep on each side of the parade route. I was told that it was the longest parade in the history of Monroe parades with approximately 5,000 people attending. It took an hour and 45 minutes to walk the parade route. It was a great success and we thanked everyone that participated.

Four members, myself included, walked along beside the trailer and passed out small bags of candy to all the children along the parade route. We gave out more than 900 bags of candy. It was enjoyed by all that were present.

This is for York Rite members only and is not open to the public or family members. Attendees are requested to please bring a chapeau of some type and a sword. Officers will be in black tie for any not in uniform for this specific evening. Light refreshments to follow.
