

Doré Exploration


In 1866, the French artist Paul Gustave Louis Christophe Doré created 241 dramatic and influential woodcuts for the two-volume French edition of the Holy Scriptures, La Grande Bible de Tours. Over the next year, we will explore the wood carvings of the Passion of the Christ, analyzing both the corresponding verses and Doré's artistic interpretation. Gustave Doré's woodcut of John 19:15 presents a striking depiction of Christ standing tall with a halo, symbolizing divine light, amidst a clear division of Jewish and Roman cultures. The artwork portrays Jesus as the bridge between Hebrew and Hellenist worlds, highlighting the ongoing relevance of the Passion narrative. The juxtaposition of the agitated mob and indifferent Romans reflects the banality and bureaucracy of evil, urging us to reflect on our collective role in the crucifixion. They compelled a passer-by, who was coming in from the country, to carry his cross; it was Simon of Cyrene, the father of Alexander and Rufus.

-Mark 15:21

Explore the woodcut of Simon of Cyrene carrying the Cross for Jesus, based on Mark's Gospel. Christ, central and illuminated by an inner light, falls to the ground while the Romans sneer menacingly in the shadows. Simon, depicted as muscular and heroic, looks to Christ with visible gratitude. 
