Grand Encampment Triennial



The Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Kansas was well represented at the 69th Triennial Communication of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar of the United States of America.

The event was held in Salt Lake City, Utah, from August 17-21, 2024. Kanas was represented by the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Gary A. Mason, Eminent Grand Generalissimo, Patrick C. Carr, Eminent Grand Captain General, Justin D. Crippen, Eminent Grand Musician, Kelly J. Long, and two Right Eminent Past Grand Commanders, Wayne H. Rollf and Butch Blackman.

The event started on Sunday with a beautiful Divine Service led by the Grand Prelate, Terry Plemmons. After the service, the Prelates in

attendance from the constituent Grand Commanderies present, with the Commissioned Templar Chaplains, were called to the front of the sanctuary to join in prayer and a healing service for those who requested it. This is templary in action.

Day two of the session started with greetings from the represented bodies who were in attendance. There

were representatives from the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar, Prince Hall Affiliation, several Grand Priories from across the globe, the Scottish Rite Southern Jurisdiction, the Masonic Order of Athelstan, the United Grand Imperial Council of the Red Cross of Constantine, the Commemorative Order of St. Thomas of Acon, and several others who made the trip to Salt Lake City to enjoy times of fellowship and refreshment with the Sir Knights from across the country.

The second session of the day involved various reports from the Grand Encampment concerning the business of the preceding triennial term. The Knights Templar Eye Foundation presented a national award to Dr. Thomas C. Lee, MD, for his dedicated work in fighting childhood blindness. He is the Chief of Ophthalmology, Director of the Retina Program in the Vision Center, and the Associate Chair of Ophthalmology at Children's Hospital Los Angeles. He is also the Associate Professor of Clinical Ophthalmology at Keck School of Medicine of the University of Southern California, a Knights Templar Eye Foundation Grant Recipient, and a member of the Knights Templar Scientific

Advisory Committee.





Day three started with the business of the session. Several articles of business were presented to the delegates. Two passed and two failed. The two which passed were to allow the candidates in the asylum while the opening of the Order of Malta was conducted, and to make a change to the short form of the Malta ritual to include the declaration of faith from the regular conferral ritual. The two which failed were concerning having no work on the Thursday, Friday, and Saturday before Easter, and changing the per capita if a Sir Knight belonged to two separate commanderies.

The election was held during the second session and Sir Knight David Kussman was reelected to serve as Most Eminent Grand Master, Sir Knight Jeff Bolstad was elected

as Deputy Grand Master, Sir Knight Jack Harper was elected as Grand Generalissimo, Sir Knight James McGee was elected to start the line as Grand Captain General, Sir Knight David Studley was elected as Grand Treasurer to replace a retiring Sir Knight Bobby Simmons, and Sir Knight Larry Tucker was elected once again to continue as Grand Recorder.

Sir Knight Larry Burleson was elected to the nine year term on the Permanent Fund and Sir Knight Lon Kvasager was elected to the three year term. The Knight Templar Eye Foundation had two trustee positions open and Sir Knights Jeremy Vaughn and were elected.
