Grand Commander's Message

Greetings Sir Knights,

With September comes Labor Day and the end of Summer, both unofficial and official. Labor Day, always observed on the first Monday of September, is the annual celebration of the social and economic achievements of the American worker. Labor Day became an official Federal holiday in 1894. Labor Day is called the unofficial end of Summer, with the official end of Summer being the Autumnal Equinox, which occurs on September 22nd this year.

Your Grand Officers held two (2) District meetings in August. On August 12, we were in Wilmington for the Feast of Solomon and the District #2 meeting. The Feast of Solomon was a very im-pressive ceremony along with a wonderful meal served by the local Order of the Rainbow Girls. August 16 found the officers in Waynesville for the District #9 meeting. I always enjoy going back to Waynesville as it is the site of my first York Rite Honors Day and where I have conferred the Most Excellent Master degree and the Order of Knight of York.

So, having just returned from Salt Lake City and the 69th Triennial of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar of the U.S.A, I thought I would provide you with a recap. First, I would like to thank our Dais officers, SK Michael Hoff, our Very Eminent Deputy Grand Commander, SK Raymond Casey, Jr., our Eminent Grand Generalissimo and SK Edward Allen, our Eminent Grand Captain General, who were all in attendance at the Triennial. Your commitment and service to the Grand Commandery of NC is very much appreciated by me and all the Sir Knights of NC.



RE:.DC:. James B. Steele was received and honored as the Mid-Atlantic Department Commander at the 69th Triennial.

Most Eminent Grand Master David J. Kussman announced that we had 479 Sir Knights registered at the conclave with 698 attendees including Ladies and Guests.

He also stated that the Grand Encampment has over 63,000 members worldwide, but that we sadly lost 7,300 members during the 69th Triennium. However, we are expanding worldwide. Three Charters were up for vote this year, with two of them being approved. Charters were granted to Serbia Commandery #1 and the York Grand Commandery of the United States of Mexico. The Committee has recommended that the Charter for the Grand Commandery of Paraguay not be given at this time, due to questions about their ability to support themselves.

Grand Master Kussman then stated that Section 237(c) of the Constitution provides for a National Award. This is an award which is given by the Grand Encampment at each Triennial Conclave. It is awarded to a person, not necessarily a Knight Templar, who has made an outstanding contribution to our country through civic, professional,

military, scientific, religious, etc., endeavors. The recipient of the National Award for this Triennial Conclave is Dr. Thomas C. Lee, who is the director of the Retina Program in the Vision Center at Children's Hospital Los Angeles. Dr. Lee has an active research program that focuses on developing new therapies to treat retinopathy of prematurity and retinoblastoma. He has identified a novel class of drugs to accelerate cell death of both retinoblastoma cells and vascular endothelial cells. He also studies the role that retinal stem cells play both in the formation of retinoblastoma tumors as well as replacement of damaged neurons resulting from degenerative retinal diseases. He holds membership in the American Academy of Ophthalmology, the Association for Research in Vision and Ophthalmology, Association of Pediatric Retina Surgeons, and the Ocular Oncology Research Society, and the New York Ophthalmological Society. He received his first research grant from the Knights Templar Eye Foundation.

Grand Master Kussman announced that the Knight Templar Eye Foundation has assets over \$183,000,000, with grants over \$3,000,000 given last year. Two seats for the KTEF Board of Trustees were up for election. SK David Dryer was re-elected to a seat on the Board and SK Jeremy Vaughn was elected to fill the other seat. The Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation of Knights Templar Eye Foundation, Inc., came up for a vote and were approved. As business the **KTEF** complete. the for was M.Pre.Em.Dist.Bro. Brice B. Hildreth, Governor General of the York Rite Sovereign College of North America, presented a check to the KTEF for \$6000. With the unexpected resignation of SK T. Mark Mickelson from the Permanent Fund Committee, there were two seats up for election. SK Lon Kvasager was elected to fill the three remaining years of SK Michelson's seat and SK Lee Burleson was elected to fill the full nine year seat.

We had four proposed amendments to consider:

Amendment #1 stated that 'No Grand Commandery shall hold a Conclave or perform any Templar work on the Thursday, Friday, or Saturday preceding the Grand Encampment Easter Observance'. This amendment failed.

Amendment #2 proposed that 'A Knight of Malta (candidate for the Order of the Temple) may be present in the asylum and witness the opening of a Commandery prior to his conferral of the Order of the Temple (knighting) on the same date'. This amendment passed, receiving the ³/₄ vote necessary.

Amendment #3 proposed that a SK who was a member of more than one Commandery would only have to pay the

assessment levied by the Grand Encampment in only one of those Commanderies. This amendment failed.

Amendment #4 proposed to add the following question from p. 76, lines 10-12 (2019 edition) of the Full Form of the Order of Malta to the Short Form of Malta on p. 62, immediately following line 2 and prior to the presentation of the Malta jewel.

Prior: My Brother, do you believe that the Savior died on the Cross for the remission of sin?

Candidate: I do.

This amendment passed.

Also considered for vote was a standing resolution that would provide a letter to the owner of the "Chivalric Fraters" tartan, #13554, authorizing him to re-register it under the new name, "The Grand Encampment of Knights Templar of the United States of America" and to transfer all rights and ownership of said tartan, without cost, to the Grand Encampment. This resolution was adopted.

The final order of business was the election of officers for the 70^{th} Triennial. Below is the list of the elected officers:
