February Message from the Grand Commander

Sir Knights,

This month, again, we focus on a saint, one associated with this season.

St. Valentine's Day on February 14th is associated with romantic love. Ironically, the day originally commemorated the martyrdom of St. Valentine, an early Roman priest, on February 14, 269 AD. There were many early Christians named Valentine, and three early saints named Valentine whose days of martyrdom fell on February 14: Valentine of Rome, Valentine of Terni, and a Valentine said to have been martyred in Africa, about whom nothing else is known. Whether Valentine of Rome and Valentine of Terni are the same person is debated.

According to the earliest story about him, Valentine of Rome was arrested for evangelizing. A judge named Asterius brought his blind adopted daughter Julia to Valentine, and Valentine prayed for her and restored her sight. The judge released Valentine, and he and his family became Christians. Subsequently, Valentine was again arrested and martyred. Later stories said that he wrote a letter to Julia before his martyrdom, signing it, "Your Valentine." He was also said to have performed secret weddings for Roman soldiers whom the emperor had forbidden to marry. This probably led to the association of his day with romantic love.

The original Knights Templar flourished in the days when courtly love and stories of romance became popular. As modern Knights, we should continue the chivalrous conduct that they exemplified. Caring for our ladies and families should be one of our top priorities.

In February, we also celebrate Candlemas, the Feast of the Presentation. It falls on February 2nd, commemorating the presentation of the baby Jesus in the Temple, 40 days after his birth. The actions of Simeon and Anna, who told others of their encounter with the Christ Child, encourage us to share the good news of his coming, and of our encounter with him.

This Templar year is rapidly drawing to a close. Please plan to be at the Grand Conclave in Nashville on March 25th. In fact, come for all the Grand York Rite and Grand Lodge session. All Commanderies should bring your Beauseant (and a stand), and designate someone to carry it. We will march in with them and display them in the west. I am looking forward to a great time!

Take Care of Yourself




