As you know we have two charities we support in the Grand Commandery, the Knights Templar Eye Foundation and the Knights Templar Holy Land Pilgrimage.

The Knights Templar Eye Foundation, incorporated in 1956, is a charity sponsored by the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar. The original mission of the Foundation was "to provide assistance to those who face loss of sight due to the need for surgical treatment without regard to race, color, creed, age, sex or national origin provided they are unable to pay or receive adequate assistance from current government agencies or similar sources and to provide funds for research in curing diseases of the eye." On December 31, 2010, the Knights Templar Eye Foundation, Inc., by direction of the board, shifted the Foundation's focus and adopted a new mission statement "to through improve vision education, and supporting access to care." Since its inception, the Foundation has expended over \$170 million on research, patient care, and education.

Research grants totaling in excess of \$36 million have been awarded to researchers working in the fields of pediatric ophthalmology and ophthalmic genetics.

I am proud to announce to those of you who have not heard, last year North Carolina became the latest state to have 100% participation in the Eye Foundation Life Sponsor program. Each Sir Knight may become a Life Sponsor with a one-time gift of \$30. I want to congratulate you on this achievement and let's strive to keep NC 100%! Just as an update to this program, our Grand Recorder, Allen Surratt, states that due to generous giving, North Carolina is very close to having 200% participation!!!

The Knight Templar Holy Land Pilgrimage is program of the Grand Encampment to send credentialed Christian Ministers on a Biblical study and a historical and cultural immersion experience to the Holy Land.

Again, I want to thank you for a great year and the opportunity to serve you as Grand Commander. I would like to leave you with a quote from Albert Pike:

"What we have done for ourselves alone dies with us; what we have done for others and the world remains and is immortal."
