Walking in Wisdom

Scripture: "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom, and knowledge of the Holy One is understanding." — Proverbs 9:10 (NIV)

Devotional:

Wisdom is more than just knowledge or intelligence—it is the ability to apply godly insight to life's choices. The Bible consistently teaches that true wisdom begins with a reverent fear of the Lord. This fear is not about being afraid of God, but about having deep respect, awe, and trust in Him.
