

Shift the weight of the body to the right leg, left knee straight.

If the team is less than a full commandery front go to the position three paces in front of the right file (if right dress) or the left file (if left dress) and face front. - Then he moves to his position.

Note:

- If the captain deems it necessary to move a Knight or Knights up or back, only the Knight or Knights moved will be scored by their respective judges.
- The Captain will be scored only after the command front has been given.

Note:

- After aligning the team, the Captain or a Platoon Leader gives the command: Front, the movement is not complete until the knight giving the command faces front.
- The position for the knight to go to before facing front is determined by the position of the team. If the team is in a full commandery front go to the position three paces in front of and centered on the commandery and face front.
- If the team is less than a full commandery front go to the position three paces in front of the right file (if right dress) (which is normally the guide) or the left file (if left dress) and face front.
- They may then move to a different position if necessary for the next command.
- If the alignment is by platoons and the platoon leaders are checking the alignment, after Front they move to their previous position beside the right or left file and face front.

WHEELING (Par. 80)

Wheelings are of two kinds, on fixed or moving pivots. In all wheels, the guide on the marching flank keeps the pivot constantly in view (Paragraph 18); to this end, the Knight next to him keeps the line of his shoulders a little to the rear, but in the same direction.

ADDENDUM (Par. 80)

In the execution of all wheels, whether on fixed pivots or moving pivots, head and eyes are turned simultaneously with the first step of the wheel. Head and eyes are turned back to the front simultaneously with the first step following the completion of the wheel. When the wheel terminates with a halt, head and eyes are turned simultaneously with the last movement of the halt; that is, as the feet are brought together (Paragraph 67).

Head Movements Following Successive Formulations into Line (Examples: Paragraphs 205, 207, 241, 303 and 304)

In successive formations into line, each element halts and dresses successively upon arriving in line. The Knights of each element complete the halt in unison with head and eyes straight to the front. On the first count after the halt is completed, head and eyes are turned in unison to dress. A count is one-half of one second.


WHEELINGS ON A FIXED PIVOT (Par. 81)

THE FIXED PIVOT IS USED IN WHEELING FROM LINE INTO COLUMN, OR FROM COLUMN INTO LINE.


The pivot Knight marks time in place, turning to conform to the marching flank.

The Knight on the marching flank takes the full step and looks toward the pivot. All keep touch of elbows toward the pivot, head and eyes turned toward the marching flank, regulating the length of step accordingly.


WHEELING ON A MOVING PIVOT (Par. 82)

THE MOVING PIVOT IS USED IN CHANGING DIRECTION OF COLUMN IN

MARCHING, AND IN SOME SUCCESSIVE FORMATIONS.

The pivot Knight takes a short step, thus gaining ground forward, describing a circle the radius of which is always 30 inches, regulating the length of step to correspond to the marching flank. The Knight on the marching flank takes the full step (except when in a column of twos when the step shortens as shown below to just over 17 inches) and looks toward the pivot. All keep touch of elbows toward the pivot, head and eyes turned toward the marching flank, regulating the length of step accordingly.

DISTANCES BETWEEN KNIGHT, COLUMNS, and GUIDES

In Computing distances,

- The breadth of a Knight is taken at 22-inches.
- His depth at 12 inches.
- This gives 10 inches from breast to back (facing distance) between ranks in column of files.

Columns:

- Between column of twos 32 inches.
- Between column of threes 54 inches.
- Between column of sections 120 inches (4 Paces).
- Between Column of platoons (Class B) = 180 inches (6 Paces); (Class) = 240 inched (8 Paces).

The distance of the leading guide from the leading file:

- Column of Twos 32 inches.
- Column of Threes 54 inches.
- Column of Sections 54 inches.

Commandery distance:

- Class A = 16 paces.
- Class B 12 paces.
- Class C = 8 paces.
- Class D = 4 paces.

AT THE COMMAND OPEN RANKS

No. 2 Knight: Backstep six steps (Par. 66) to mark the new alignment of the rear rank.

Captain: Moves to the right flank two paces in prolongation of the alignment, facing the knight and sees

that the No. 2 Knight is on a line parallel to and three paces behind the front rank, then places himself facing the left, three paces in front of the right file (No. 1 Knight) of the front rank, and

commands: 2. March.

AT THE COMMAND MARCH

Knights in Line: The front rank, the odd numbered Knights, dress to the right without closing intervals; the even

numbered Knights who constitute the rear rank, turn head and eyes to the right, backstep, halt a

little in the rear of the alignment, and dress to the right without closing interval.

Captain: Faces left, moves to the right flank two paces in prolongation of the alignment, faces right

superintends the alignment of the front rank, faces left, goes to the right of the rear rank (No. 2 Knights) verifies the alignment of the rear rank, faces right, then moves to a point three paces in front of the right file (No. 1 Knight) of the front rank, faces left and commands: 3. *Front*. Faces

the front.



without command.

execute (on the 3rd count) twos left on a moving pivot (4 steps) and Halt, dressing to the right

on the No. 1 Knight without command (Par. 75).

Captain: Marches four paces beyond the wheeling point of the leading twos (two paces beyond the No. 1

Knight). Halts, faces about in position to verify the alignment.

Last Twos: The last twos, after completing Twos Right About, Mark Time and step off in echelon on the

3rd count and execute Twos Left (the second two in place) on moving pivot (3 steps), and then advance into line, halting a few inches behind the line, dressing to the right without command.

Captain: The last twos having arrived in line, verifies the alignment, being satisfied, commands:






